FINAL RESOLUTION AND ORDER RESOLUTION NO. 2013V-01

Now on this 22nd day of January 2013, at a duly constituted and regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, Lincoln County, Kansas, all members of said board being present, the matter of the vacation of a certain road comes on for final hearing and order before said board.

After due consideration, and after being duly advised in the premises, the board finds, that on the 7th day of January, 2013, the said board did unanimously make a preliminary resolution proposing to vacate a certain section line road, as in their judgement said road is not a public utility by reason of neglect, nonuse, or inconvenience or from other cause or causes said road has become practically impassable and the necessity for said road as a public utility does not justify the expenditure of the necessary funds to repair said road or put the same in condition for public travel; said road described as follows:

That part of a county line road lying in Lincoln County which begins at the Northeast corner of Section 36 thence south following the curve in the road to the Southeast corner of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4) all in Township 13S, Range 6W. Right of way being 40 ft.

and that said preliminary resolution is herewith adopted and made a part of this order by reference.

The board further finds that due and legal notice of said proposed vacation has been given by publication as required by law, and the proof thereof has been duly filed with the County Clerk.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ALL MEMBERS VOTING IN THE AFFIRMATIVE: That the above described road, and every part hereof, should be vacated, and it is hereby vacated, as above described, and that the County Clerk enter the proceedings concerning said vacation upon the records, and that a copy thereof will be certified to the Register of Deeds, Lincoln County, Kansas.
