Courthouse/Law Enforcement Needs:

The board discussed the repairs needed to the courthouse identified during the assessment. Before deciding on repairs to the north and east entrances, the board requested to speak to Sheriff Dustin Florence regarding the potential for a future jail on the north side of the courthouse. The board and Sheriff Florence discussed the concerns with the current law enforcement building and its deterioration. Florence related that he has been in contact with an architect to determine an estimated cost to build a new facility and has individuals interested in serving on a committee to discuss options for improvement to the facility. Florence will contact the architect to assist with identifying whether the area north of the courthouse has sufficient space for a new building in the future so that the board can make an informed decision on repairs to the courthouse entrances.

Solid Waste Collection: The board discussed the Solid Waste Collection contract to provide solid waste collection

services to Barnard, Beverly, Lincoln Center, and Sylvan Grove. Board members related that Beverly, Lincoln Center, and Sylvan Grove are interested in continuing the contract with the county. In addition, Commissioner Ray is on the agenda to visit Barnard at their next meeting.
